
Congratulations to our winners



Both Cold Ashby Playing Fields Association and the Taylor family want to thank each and every one who helped them achieve this; it was absolutely amazing!


They are planning to do it again next year - bigger and hopefully better.





HOLLOWELL AND TEETON PARISH COUNCIL

Hollowell Pocket Park – seasonal work has been undertaken to keep the hedgerows and central area of grass tidy. Further work may be undertaken on the hedgerow bordering Hollowell Lodge Farm. This hedgerow was planted when the Park was opened in 1997 and has spread out into the Park. In particular, the blackthorn has produced off shoots that needed cutting down. Thanks go to Roger Heygate (Heygate Contracting Ltd) and Mark Hazle (H & T P C's mowing contractor) for undertaking this work.

The Budget (Precept – Council Tax) – the Council is required to set a budget for each financial year and this is prepared in the November to January period. This determines how much 'Precept' or Council Tax will be levied in the next financial year (April 2020 to April 2021). It is likely that with the changes to Local Government (The formation of two unitary authorities for Northamptonshire) and the ongoing difficulties with County Council finances, the Parish Council will need to increase it's budget to account for removal of grants (e.g. mowing) and the loss of services (e.g. Support for maintaining Bus service).

The Village Hall committee hosted a delicious breakfast in October. Residents enjoyed bacon, egg and sausage baps, coffee and cakes. £167 was raised towards the maintenance of the hall. 
All the apples are hand picked, washed, pressed, fermented and bottled by Jez himself in the cider house at his home in Hollowell.

MESSAGE FROM REVEREND ALLISON TWIGG, THE UPLANDS GROUP OF CHURCHES

For this reason we have decided in the Uplands Benefice at St. Denys Ravensthorpe to offer a special service called "Blue Christmas" service on **Thursday 19th December** at 6.30 p.m. We invite you to join us in sharing and hearing prayers, readings, and music that acknowledge that God's presence is for all of us, including those who struggle and for those who mourn - and that Jesus comes to us to shine light into our darkness and to bring us hope and healing.

This is not a service to make you feel sad, but one where you can come, lay down your burdens and share in the peace of Christmas.
