

BIRDING NOTES



August/September 2024 Little Tern

Midsummer can be a quiet time for local-patch birding. In the lull between spring and autumn migration, scarce birds are generally few and far between, and resident/ summering birds can behave unobtrusively as they complete their breeding activities. I therefore arrived at Hollowell Reservoir on the

morning of June 22nd with fairly low expectations. Walking down the north-west side towards Guilsborough Bay I could see three or four Common Terns which had been present for the previous few weeks. I then noticed that there was another much smaller tern moving fast above them, heading towards the sailing club. Fearing that this bird could be a 'flythrough' about to depart, I quickened my pace to try to get a better look from the vantage of Guilsborough Bay Point. As I reached that location the bird headed back towards me, giving better views. Through my binoculars I could see from the striking head pattern and long black-tipped yellow bill that I was looking at a Little Tern: my first for Northamptonshire, and in fact the first time I'd seen this species anywhere away from the coast. I was fortunate to be able to watch the bird for half an hour as it patrolled the reservoir from end to end, often hovering and then diving for small fish, one time doing this no more than 20 metres in front of me, hitting the water with a loud 'smack' as it did so. The bird also exhibited its typically dashing, fast flight action, very different to the buoyant flight of the Common Terns; it also showed off its distinctive structure, with relatively short tail streamers and long, swept-back wings.

Little Terns breed in small colonies around the coast of the British Isles. As a breeding species they are scarce and local, with a British population of around 2,000 pairs. I have often seen them in Norfolk and Northumberland, but they are fairly rare inland, so I was very happy to encounter this bird on my local patch. Most recent Northants records have come from sites along the Nene Valley, but as this shows, they can occur at any small to medium body of water as they migrate overland. This individual is likely to have been a late-arriving summer visitor heading from the west coast of Africa to its coastal breeding grounds in north -west Europe.

Hollowell Reservoir has recently proved fruitful for tern species: in the last twelve months I've also seen Common, Arctic, Black and Sandwich Terns here and - the highlight in terms of rarity – last July, a Caspian Tern, which I wrote about in an earlier edition of this article. Thanks for your continued interest in this feature: I appreciate the many kind comments that I have received.
